Overview



- Passed Congress, signed by President **February 17, 2009**
 - \$787 Billion, \$211 Billion for projects
- Process: Majority of funds will flow through existing channels
- Plan Goals:
 - Preference to activities that can be started & completed “expeditiously”
 - At least 50% of funds – initiated within 120 days
 - Maximize Job Creation & Economic Benefit
- All funds available through FY2010
- No Earmarks or “Pet Projects”

Transportation – Ky's Share



- Highways & Bridges - \$421M
 - \$282M – any area in state
 - \$40.6M – large urban areas (200K+)
 - \$72.6M - Population 200K-
 - \$13.2M – Population under 5,000
- \$12.6M set-aside for Transportation Enhancements

Water / Sewer



- USDA / Rural Development:
 - \$2B – Water/Sewer - Grants
 - \$4B – Water/Sewer - Loans
 - \$35M Grants, \$90M Loans – Kentucky Estimate
- Ky Infrastructure Authority:
 - Water - \$19M - from EPA
 - Sewer - \$49M - from EPA
- Funds for Revolving State Loan Funds – Stimulus Plan includes “forgivable” principal and/or Grants

Pennyrile ADD Projects Total **\$282M**

Aging

- \$451K – Title V Older Workers
- \$1.47M – Senior Meals
 - \$985K – Congregate Meals
 - \$485K – Home Delivered



Workforce – WIA Formula Grants



- \$44.6M estimated in Ky
 - Adult - \$8M
 - Dislocated Workers - \$18.7M
 - Youth - \$17.7M
- West Kentucky WIB
 - Adult - \$1M
 - Dislocated Workers - \$1.1M
 - Youth - \$1.7M



Broadband

- \$2.5B Federal (USDA)
- \$4.7B – Dept of Commerce
- USDA “Webinar” March 10th
- NADO “Webinar” March 11th

No specific Kentucky allotment – all Nationally Competitive



Community Development Block Grant (CDBG)

- \$1B - Nationally
- \$12.4M – Kentucky's Allotment

Economic Development Administration

- \$150M Nationally
- \$3M – Kentucky Estimate



Energy

- Energy Efficiency Block Grants
 - \$2.8B – Nationally
 - \$50M – Kentucky
- Weatherization Assistance
 - \$5B – Nationally
 - \$92.6M - Kentucky



Ky Dept of Energy & Area Development Districts are meeting to discuss potential projects & involvement

Housing

- Federal (USDA):
 - \$1B in Direct Loans
 - \$10.5B Loan Guarantees
- Neighborhood Stabilization Programs - \$2B
No Ky Allocation, Nationally Competitive Only
- HOME Improvement Program - \$2.25B –
coordinated w/Low Income Housing Tax Credit –
Rental Projects Only

Community Facilities (USDA Rural Development)

- \$63M Grants, \$1.7B Loans – Hospitals, Community Centers, etc.

Ky Allocation Unknown at this time



Emergency Management

- FEMA
 - \$210M – Firefighter’s Assistance Grants
 - No State Allocation / Nationally Competitive



Brownfields

- EPA
 - Federal - \$100M
 - No State Allocation – Nationally Competitive
 - Can fund existing “backlog” applications

Fort Campbell

- Total of \$107M
 - \$43M – new Warrior Transition Bn Complex
 - \$64M – Maintenance & Repair projects



Other \$ for Kentucky

- Medicaid - \$990M
- Education - \$924M
- Health / Welfare - \$272M
- General Fund - \$120M
- Airports
